**WILLIAM J. BRATTON** led police departments in Boston, New York, and Los Angeles, revolutionizing all of them into 21<sup>st</sup> century security forces. Under his watch, each department dramatically reduced crime and improved the safety of those cities. Recently, he was asked to advise the British government on gang-related issues following the riots this summer.

In their new book, Bratton and Harvard Kennedy School's Zachary Tumin lay out a field-tested, streetwise playbook on how to share information and collaborate across groups, divisions, agencies, companies, and industries in today's networked world.

Bratton and Tumin illustrate through Bratton's own experiences as police commissioner and chief, as well through in-depth examples from Fortune 100 companies, education, social work and the military, how collaboration is central to success. Perhaps more importantly, they issue a warning to employees and companies who don't find a way to collaborate effectively: those who cannot work across boundaries are the ones doomed to perish.

Collaboration was the hallmark of Bratton's own career—perhaps no one in law enforcement is better known for his ability to get competing departments, agencies, government, and private industry to work together to improve the safety of their citizens and city.
